## **Activity Title: What is GDPR?**

**Level:** L2- Average

**Duration:** 40 minutes

### **Short description - Goals**

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**Goals:** to learn more about GDPR and the dangers of giving out personal information

**Other aims of the activity:**

After the end of the activity, students should be able to define concepts such as GDPR. Moreover, they should be able to relate specific behavior (and actions) to these concepts, to understand how and why it can be dangerous to share personal information.

**Method:** Presentation / Discussion

### **Requirements – Instructions**

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The realization of the activity requires:

- 1) Computer and Projector
- 2) Internet access
- 3) Whiteboard

### **Scenario**

Ask students if they are aware of what GDPR is and how it affects them.

Watch a clip about GDPR to get a basic understanding of GDPR ([\(1\) GDPR explained: How the new data protection act could change your life - YouTube](#) or [\(1\) What is the GDPR? | A summary of the EU GDPR - YouTube](#))

Discuss what they talked about in the clip and the dangers of giving out personal information or give a power point presentation about GDPR.
